**From South:** Step #1 - Take **I-65N** to **Watterson E** (I-264E)

{or, From West: Step #1a - Take **Watterson E** (I-264E)

#2 - **Go E.** on **Watterson E.**

#3 - **Go N.** on **Breckenridge Ln.**

#4 - **Continue N.** when Breckenridge Ln. Becomes **Chenoweth Ln.**

(at intersection with Frankfort Ave. And Shelbyville Rd.) (light)

#5 - **Follow Chenoweth until** it dead ends at **Second Presbyterian.**

**From Southeast.** Step #1 - Take **I-64W** to **Breckenridge Ln. N.**

#2 - **Follow directions #3, 4, 5 above.**

**From East:** Step #1 - Take **Shelbyville Rd. W.** into **St. Matthews** area.

#2 - **Turn N.** (right) onto **Chenoweth Ln.** (light)

#3 - **Follow directions #5 above.**

**From Northeast:** Step #1 - Take **Brownsboro Ln. W.** To **Chenoweth Ln.** (light)

#2 - **Turn N** (right) - **Chenoweth Ln. dead ends at Second Presbyterian.**

OR

Step #1 - Take **I-71S**, exiting onto **Watterson W** (I-264W).

#2 - **Follow I-264 W** and **exit** at **Brownsboro Rd. W.**

#3 - **Follow directions above for approach from Northeast.**

### Speakers...

...**Anthony Redfeather Nava's** lives the Native American traditions of his Kituhwa Cherokee and Pascua Yaqui family through teaching, performance, and craft. He practices many different art forms, from dancing, flute making, and beadwork to flint knapping and drum making. Anthony constantly combines traditions and ideas to form his own artistic style. He challenges stereotypes about Native American music when he uses traditional instruments to play pop songs. In Native American arts and traditions, it's all about what you bring to the table. 'You're taught what you need to know– the basics are given to you. The rest you have to learn or figure out...We always share knowledge...'

...**Carolyn Diener**, from Harvey Browne Presbyterian Church, said in her report of her USAME (USA Mission Experience)...'I had the rare opportunity to be part of the USAME to South Dakota, representing the Synod of the Living Waters...It was great to be able to travel and share ideas and experiences with 20 outstanding Presbyterian Women from Synods from throughout the country...We met with Native American Presbyterians in locations from Sioux Falls in eastern South Dakota to Rapid City on the western border. Our purpose was to listen, learn, show solidarity, and come back to tell our Presbyterian friends in our home areas the stories and concerns of those we met.' It was Carolyn's experiences that led her to suggest the offering recipients for this gathering.
