**PROJECT #1**

**FRIENDS OF OUR TROOPS**

Circle and church members purchase Christmas cards before Thanksgiving - on the inside of the card and preferably the left side they write a short newsy note. (Your name, where you live, location, like small town Rogersville in Tennessee, maybe a little about you and your family, pets, hobbies or whatever) We sign our name, mention how much you appreciate them serving in the military and helping to protect our freedom, etc. We do not seal the envelope, put the flap down inside, and on the outside of the envelope in the upper left corner, put an address sticker - nothing else. These will be taken up on a date announced, put in a mailing package, and sent by Post Office to Friends of Our Troops, P.O. Box 65408, Fayetteville, N.C. 28306-5408. Note; material may be obtained from this same address if you wish to become involved in this project. Many volunteers sort the cards in bundles of 100 and mail to military station camps for them to look, read and left as they move from base to base.

We have received many answers back to members thanking them for sending and taking the time to remember them. The cards stay there throughout the year. It is required to put 25 cents postage with each card you fix to help send them to these other bases. A very rewarding project to help other persons.

Inside your material will be a form to fill out with the name of the organization and number of cards plus money for postage.

**PROJECT #2**

We participate in **NET WORKERS MALARIA PREVENTION PROGRAM**. It is done on Mother's Day. Materials are ordered and include a form to put names and the name of the Mother they are purchasing a mosquito net - either in memory or in honor of. I like this because so many of us do not have our Mothers now with us and it is such a nice memorial gift to give in honor of them. Each net cost \$10.00 and money collected is mailed in and nets are purchased in the country where they are given. - a lot cheaper to get them that way. Cards are enclosed that can be sent in honor of Mothers that are still living. This is a wonderful way to remember Mothers living or dead by remembering others who may not live long, mother or child, by safe guarding them against malaria. We had a very good response last year for our small group - 19 mosquito nets were purchased - I think this might be good to offer this project to the men also!
